CSLC 10102/60002 BEGINNING SWAHILI II

This course is intended for students who have taken Beginning Swahili I or are at a high-beginner level through other means. In this course, students will continue to build on the language skills previously gained, ultimately making more complex oral and written statements about themselves, their friends, and their world. Components of the cultures of Swahili-speaking peoples will be woven throughout the course.

CSLC 20201/60201 INTERMEDIATE SWAHILI I

This course is intended for students who have taken Beginning Swahili II or are at a low-intermediate level through other means. In this course, students will continue to build on the language skills previously gained, improving their speaking, listening, reading and writing skills. Components of the cultures of Swahili-speaking peoples will be woven throughout the course.

CSLC 40003 ADVANCED CONVERSATIONAL SWAHILI II

This course is intended for students who have taken Intermediate Swahili II or are at a low-intermediate level through other means. In this course, students will continue to build on the language and literary skills previously gained, further engaging in analytical, critical, and creative thinking while simultaneously developing their Swahili reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills. Students will also broaden their knowledge of Swahili literary texts as well that of the society, customs and the political context of the environments in which Swahili is spoken.

All Swahili courses will be taught by Josephine Mutisya, Notre Dame's Fulbright Foreign Language Teaching Assistant for Swahili for 2020-21. She is from Mombasa, Kenya, and is very excited to continue sharing the Swahili language and culture with Notre Dame students.

CSLC 17001/60155 BEGINNING HINDI I
