This course examines the advent of Islam from Prophet Muhammad to the modern period. It will also uncover the transformation of Islamic culture's humble origins to its role as the sole premodern global culture.

Students will learn about the Ottoman, Safavid and Mughal Islamic empires which dominated cultural, political, intellectual and economic life in Afro-Eurasia.

We will pursue a number of themes in this course:

- cosmology
- climate
- theories of history
- travel and trade
- military slavery
- pilgrimage
