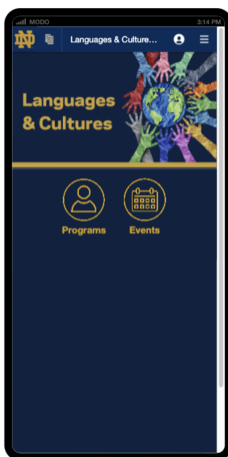


Peer Tutoring for Languages
